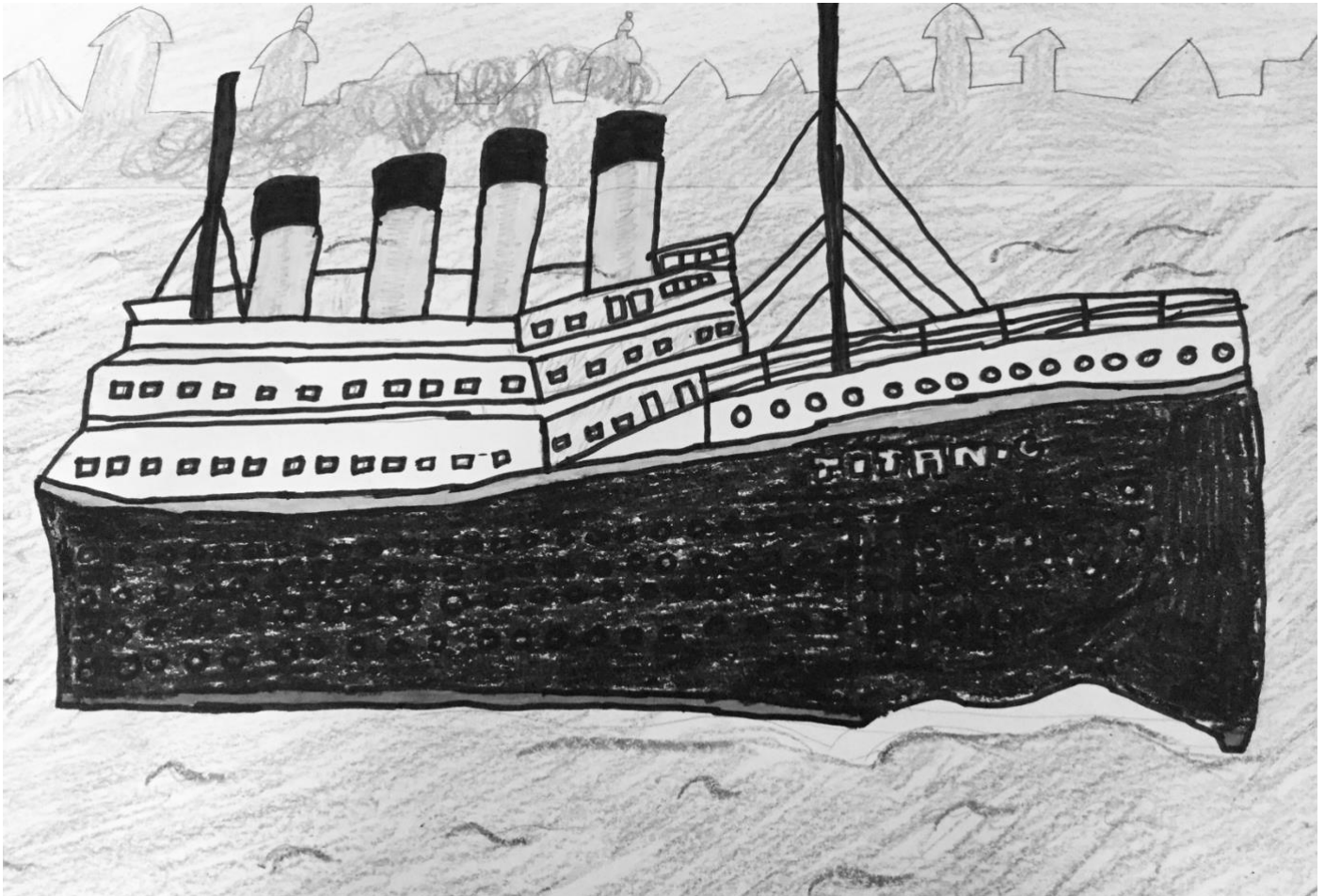


Titanic Sinks

Titanic sank at 2:20 this night. 1,500 - 1,800 dead. This majestic ship crashed into an iceberg in the middle of the night, sinking in cold water. The Titanic was built in Harland and Wolff and was on her first voyage to New York.

Passengers

The Captain of the Titanic; Captain Edward John Smith, was said to be on his last voyage before he would retire. Ironically, Captain Smith was on his last voyage since he went down with the Titanic. (For more on Captain Smith see page 4). Most females and children survived this tragedy since men weren't allowed on the life boats till most women and children were on. Some of the lifeboats went to look for passengers to save but most of them had drowned or froze to death. Other lifeboats, such as the full ones didn't save any passengers and some of those didn't want to save any because they thought that the drowning passengers would bring a lot of water into the lifeboats and make them sink.

The Tragedy

The tragedy of the Titanic isn't fully uncovered yet. The Titanic hit an iceberg and sank leaving many people to die. The Carpathia, another ship headed to New York, luckily heard the warnings and gathered up the survivors whilst the Titanic sunk to the bottom of the ocean floor with many other passengers and staff.

Survivors

706 people survived. These included first, second and third class people. They continued their journey on the RMS Carpathia where they were taken care of and are now safely in New York. Though the tragedy has happened some survivors refuse to say anything.
