

Curriculum Newsletter



Year 5 November - Christmas 2018

Literacy:

This half term in Literacy the children will be focussing on the following:

Writing genre: 1. Structure and language features of procedural and instructional writing (e.g.: How to make a clay model/cook a recipe). Language and Grammar: Instructional language; plurals; reported and direct speech; comma use.

Comprehension and Reading Skills: Variety of texts working on skimming and scanning, reading for purpose and inference skills. Talking and Listening: Developing drama and expressive skills through specific activities (e.g.: Hot-seating). Spelling: New spelling rules including: verb endings; regular and irregular verbs; WAU Sound topic words; suffixes.

Tips for parents:

Keep a look out for all forms of instructional writing around the home to familiarise your child with the genre - board games/ DIY instruction manuals/ recipes. Try to spot common language features and structures for this genre. Encourage regular shared reading, allowing for discussion and questioning around the text. Ensure spellings are checked using LSCWC.

Numeracy:

This half term in Numeracy the children will explore and apply the following areas through practical investigations, games and mental maths activities:

Mathematical language of money, covering addition and subtraction of money; properties of 2D shapes; area and perimeter; language of line direction; features of angles; weight and measure; tessellation; multiplication; factors; multiples; prime numbers; fractions including equivalence; fractions and division; capacity including the units of measurement - litres & millilitres; simple programming and coding using 'Probots'.

Tips for parents:

Provide opportunities for involvement in the weekly shop! Finding totals and working out change from given amounts, reading prices from take-away menus, estimating totals and so on. In line with Literacy focus, encourage your child to follow recipes - weighing and measuring as they go. Try to ensure weekly corrections from Friday assessments are completed and signed. World Around Us

This half term in WAU the children will explore and experiment topical activities related to **Sound**, including: how sound travels over distance; investigating whether sound travelling through different media; pitch; understanding vibrations in solids, liquids and gases; grouping sounds; conducting and recording through investigation and experimentation; making a hydrophone; observing and listening to various instruments; appreciating how instruments create sound; creating their own musical instruments from waste, junk and recyclable materials.

Tips for parents:

Discuss properties of materials and states of matter - Solids/ Liquids/ Gases. Encourage children to explore making sounds with instruments which may be available to them. Begin to collect suitable waste, junk and recyclable materials which your child could use to make their own musical instrument. Internet suggestions - BBC Bitesize website: KS2 Sound.

ICT

Over this half term period the children will plan, develop, work on and refine a PowerPoint presentation in line with the UICT Task, 'See This'. The children will:

- 1. Create a presentation which is related to a topic covered in class Alexander Graham Bell.
- 2. Combine text with images and sound, use a number of transitions and use features such as text boxes, graphics, borders, bullets and numbering.

In addition to this, children will explore aspects of e-safety and improve touch typing skills via the school Year 5 Learning Zone.

Religion

Children will have the opportunity to explore the following: Their understanding of Jesus and of the Advent season; the Sacrament of Penance and preparing well for the coming of Jesus; take part in preparations for the school Carol service.

Children will examine the following areas:
