## Reading Challenge Activities:

- 1. Draw a picture of your favourite part of the story and describe what you have drawn.
- 2. Find five interesting words in the text. Write down the meaning of each word then use each one in a sentence of your own.
- 3. Give the book you have read marks out of ten and explain why you have given it that mark.
- 4. Write down any new word you have found in your book and use a dictionary to record what each word means.
- 5. In the text you are reading, find all the words with apostrophes. Write down each word and explain why there is an apostrophe there.
- 6. Make a list of ten common nouns and five proper nouns in the text you have read.
- 7. Find ten **adjectives** in the text and write them down. Make up some sentences. Each sentence must contain at least three adjectives.
- 8. Draw a picture of your favourite character from the story. Write a description of who they are and what you have learnt about them from your reading.
- 9. Write five questions you could ask someone to find out if they have read this book carefully.
- 10. Write down some facts you have learnt from a non-fiction text.
- 11. Choose a descriptive word from the text and write it down. Using a thesaurus, write down 5 similar words to your original word.
- 12. Draw a picture of one of the settings in the story then write a description of where it is and what happened there.
- 13. Design a poster for the book you have read to persuade other people to read the story.
- 14. Draw your favourite character from the story you have read. Copy down three things the writer says about this person.
- 15. Make a list of words and phrases that you think are effective in making you want to keep reading the book.
- 16. Think of three questions you would ask one of the character. Write the answers to the questions as if you were the character.
- 17. Make a list of the words and phrases used in the story to create atmosphere. What is the atmosphere of the book? E.g. relaxing, scary?
- 18. Write about an experience or memory of your own that is similar to something you have read in the book.
- 19. Pretend you are one of the characters in the book and write a diary entry for one day in the story.
- 20. Which character in the story would you most like to be? Explain your answer.
